TAXES NOW IN EFFE

By requirement of the Emerald City and in order to assure a community chest for the medicines, foods and other items that our town so greatly needs, a new TAX POLICY is being enacted. Each resident of Horizon Stronghold shall pay THREE BITS every tax-season. In the interest of fairness, those not eligible for full votes will pay a reduced amount: TWO BITS for partial votes, ONE

BIT for those who cannot vote.

To lighten the burden, the Treasury has agreed to accept certain goods at a reasonable discount from market value. At least ONE BIT per Person

must be paid in cash, for we must have coin to send to the Emerald City. Overpayment may be logged as a CREDIT against future taxes, or may be spent to help pay the taxes of others.

A table of tax exchange values follows:

- Fuel: 3 bits
- Potion: 3 bits
- Lock-and-key set: 5 bits
- Scroll: 9 bits

Arts, Rituals, Artifacts, Weapons and Devices must be negotiated individually. Goods must be necessary for the town's stores to be accepted. Common medical supplies - Trance, Petrolatum,

Elixir and Restore - are always accepted.

New Revisions to the Laws in Horizon's Stronghold

Horizon's Stronghold

"Do no harm and no harm shall come to you."

Positions of Authority

Those in authority in Horizon's Stronghold are there to further the prosperity and protect the town. In order to be eligible for a position, one must be a Citizen. Those in the positions of Mayor, Judge, Deputy of Invention, Treasurer, and Sheriff are responsible for upholding and altering the law as needed. Citizens may petition to have laws altered or new laws reversed in town hall meetings.

Mayor: The elected leader of the town who has authority that supersedes all other government positions. The Mayor is still subject to the law. If the Mayor is unable to fulfill their duty the Judge takes up the Mayor's duties until a new elected official can be chosen. The Mayor receives a monthly salary of 6 emeralds for their service (after taxes). Room and board provided.

Judge: An elected official who oversees all trials and decides innocence or guilt. If the Judge is unable to fulfill their duty the Marshal takes up the Judge's duties until a new elected official can be chosen. The position of Judge is decided by a majority vote of the people. This position may be put up to election by the mayor in the spring. The Judge receives a monthly salary of 5 emeralds for their service (after taxes). Room and board provided.

Deputy of Invention: The Deputy of Invention is the head of a special task force to solve local problems. They report directly to and are advised by the Mayor on their current project(s). The position of Deputy of Invention is appointed by the mayor and may be recalled at anytime. Deputy of invention receives a monthly salary of 4 emeralds for their service (after taxes). Room and board

Treasurer: The Treasurer is in charge of the town's finances and is responsible for collecting and setting the taxes each month. The position of Treasurer is decided by a majority vote of the people. This position may be put up to election by the mayor in the spring. The Treasurer receives a monthly salary of 4 emeralds for their service (after taxes). Room and board provided.

Marshal: An elected official who commands the local law enforcement, while defending and enforcing the laws. If the Marshal is unable to fulfill the Deputy Marshal takes up the Marshal's duties until a new elected official can be chosen. The position of Marshal is decided by a majority vote of the people. This position may be put up to election by the mayor in the spring. The Marshal receives a monthly salary of 4 emeralds for their service (after taxes). Room and board provided.

Deputy Marshal: The 2nd in command in local law enforcement. The position of Deputy Marshal is appointed by the Sheriff and may be recalled at anytime. The Deputy Marshal receives a monthly salary of 3 emeralds for their service (after taxes). Room and board provided.

Officer: An Officer is a member of the local law enforcement. The position of Officer is appointed by the Sheriff and may be recalled at anytime. An Officer receives a monthly salary of 2 emeralds for their service (after taxes). Room and board provided.

Law Enforcement

The members of the local law enforcement are entrusted to uphold and enforce the law. Law enforcement can be identified by the Star worn on their lapel. Special Service to the Ruler of Oz wear a silver star. National officers such as Tin Men wear a tin star. Local officers such as the Marshal, Deputy, and his Officers wear a brass or copper star. Temporary officers, when required, wear a cloth star. In the line of duty an Officer should strive to defend the laws and the people by non-lethal means. An Officer may see a situation where lethal force is warranted and this grim duty is lawful in defense of the law. An Officer may arrest anyone suspected of a crime for two hours for questioning. At the end of the two hours the suspect must be charged and awaiting trial or released. Trials should be swift and held within 24 hours of the arrest, circumstances permitting.

Every Autumn, the position of Mayor is put to a vote. All citizens are expected to participate in the voting process. Once elected, the Mayor has the option of placing the position of Judge, Marshal or Deputy up for election, whose

Election takes place in Spring. Voting counts as follows: Citizens vote count as one vote Changeling Citizens count as 2/3rds vote Non-Citizens count as 1/2 vote Changeling Non-Citizens do not get to vote. Whomever has the most votes at the end of the election wins.

Death or absence of an official: In the unfortunate circumstances that an official dies or is unable to fulfill their duty, a special election will be held 2 months after. Should he be returned as a construct, they may fulfill their duty until the election is completed. They may not return to their position until they regain citizenship.

Citizenship

THE

With the recent opening of Oz's borders, and the rise in threats from outside forces, it is necessary to have a path to citizenship. In order to make all equitable under the law, eligibility to citizenship applies to all living within the borders of Oz.

Humans living in Oz before the Great Spell faded are granted automatic citizenship. A non-citizen must have a sponsor for citizenship. The sponsor agrees to pay an equal fine should the non-citizen commit any crimes. Sponsorship lasts a minimum of 6 months.

Upon completing Sponsorship, The non-citizen and sponsor meet before a Judge. The Sponsor announces that the non-citizen is worthy of citizenship, the non-citizen makes an oath of fealty to the Nation of Oz. Character witnesses may then speak on behalf or against the non-citizen. The Judge had the final word on granting citizenship to the non-citizen.

Should the non-citizen fail to pass citizenship, he may attempt the process again with a new sponsor.

A newly formed Construct does not retain his Citizenship that he held in life, and must seek it anew.

Nomes are forbidden from acting as sponsors.

Changeling must have a Certificate of Domesticity before they may seek sponsorship.

Fines are doubled for non-Citizens. If a non-Citizen is sponsored, His sponsor pays half of the fine, and he pays half of the fine. Non-Domesticated Changeling are not tolerated within the borders of Oz. Changeling who break the laws lose their Certificate of Domestication. If they are not Domesticated and they commit a crime, they are to be put down. The Judge may levy alternative fines and/or punishments in severe cases.

- 1. Any act of assault will be dealt with by a fine of 4 bits, 75% of which will go to the victim and no less than 24 hours in jail. Assault is defined as doing physical, spiritual, or severe emotional harm to an individual. Manipulation of free will through magical or other means is also seen as assault.
- 2. Any act of assault with clear intent to kill will be dealt with by a fine of 12 bits, 75% of which will go to the victim and no less than one month in the local jail.
- 3. Any act of murder will be dealt with by a fine of 5 Emeralds, 75% of which will go to the victim's next of kin and no less than 6 months in the local jail. The punishment for murder can also include execution but this must be signed off on by the Mayor, Judge, and Marshal.
- 4. Any act of theft will be dealt with by a fine of Twice the value of the stolen item, 75% of which will go to the victim.
- 5. Any act that results in the willful destruction or damaging of property will be dealt with by a fine of Twice the value of the damaged property, 75% of which will go to the victim.
- 6. Any act that interferes with local law enforcement will be dealt with by a fine of 4 bits.
- 7. Any act of public drunkenness or recklessness will be dealt with by a fine of 3 bits.
- 8. The casting of involuntary necromancy (raising the dead) will be dealt with by a fine of 2 Emeralds and no less than 3 months in jail.
- 9. Creation of a construct without the permission of the constructed party will be dealt with by a fine of 2 Emeralds, 75% of which will go to the victim and no less than 3 months in jail.
- 10. An deliberately wrongful accusations of a crime will be dealt with by a fine of 4 Bits, 75% of which will go to the victim.
- 11. Unregistered Witches Pose a serious threat to the Nation of Oz. A discovered, unregistered witch will be fined 8 bit and no less than 1 month in Jail.
- 12. Acts of Treason will not be tolerated. Anyone found guilty of Treason will pay a fine of 5 Emeralds and no less than 1 year in the local jail. The punishment for Treason can also include execution but this must be signed off on by the Mayor, Judge, and Marshal.
- 13. Anyone found aiding, abiding, or not reporting suspicious activity will be met with a fine of 4 bits. If they are doing so on behalf of a traitor, the fine is raised to 2 Emeralds, and can lead to 3 months Jail
- 14. Anyone caught committing food related crimes during the great rationing will be forcible changed to a construct and turned over to their next of kin as property, unless tangible damage was done, in which case the construct becomes property of the wronged party or their next of kin.
- 15. Each month the treasurer will announce the taxation amount for that tax period. No citizen may be taxed more than 1 emerald per taxation period. Non-citizens will pay a filing fee of 2 bits each taxation

period. Taxes may be paid with goods and food at a 10% fee to their fair market value. If the goods are worth more than the current tax rate an account will be opened to pay for future tax periods.

16. Failure to pay taxes will carry the fine of the current amount owed plus 50% or a day of servitude to the town per bit owed.

Witches

The nation of Oz promotes the advancement and creation of all technologies. But just as an inventor registers a device with the national patent office, a witch must register with local law enforcement. When a witch or other magic user moves into the area, they must notify the Mayor, Judge, and Marshal of their presence. This includes their magical leanings, abilities, and reasons for relocating. Local officials have the option to require a witch to wear specific markings, allowing their neighbors to identify them without direct communication. An unregistered witch is punishable by law.

Domesticated Changeling

Due to the unpredictable nature of Changelings, Changelings living in town must prove they are fit for society. Changeling may seek a Certificate of Domesticity, which documents a Changeling's training to live amongst humans in society. Certificates of Domesticity are granted by an Elder, defined as the Changeling who has lived the longest in town. Exact tests are up to the Elder, but may include: public service, obedience training, character testimony, and fees. Should the changeling meet the Elder's requirement, she will receive a certificate of Domesticity. Should an Elder be found irresponsible in his duties, he may be overturned as elder and a new one will be chosen by the Mayor, Judge and Marshal of town.


